Strategic Plan Goal: Goal 4- Continuous Growth, All Students, All Subjects

Outcome: c. Increased growth rate for students experiencing personal and/or systemic barriers to achievement or opportunity.

Academic Gap Goal: The intact group of students served in Title and Resource for academic services will show an increase of 8 raw score points on average in easyCBM reading fluency, and a 10% increase on the raw score average in easyCBM math performance from Fall 2023 to Spring 2024, as shown on easyCBM benchmark and progress monitoring data.

Actions:

- Implement grade level and vertical PLCs with use of Teams technology and Teacher Clarity-infused data-teaming sessions.
- Integrate Quarterly PLCs following Benchmark Assessment Data.
- Review data on a 6-week cycle
- Daily use of R4R Foundational Skills CORE routines for all students in 1-2.
- Utilize Sound Partners small group interventions for targeted students receiving Title services.
- Provide individual and small group research-based supplemental interventions for targeted students (Lexia, Heggerty- both in the general education setting and special education setting).
- Monitor progress of targeted (at-risk) students bi-weekly.
- Provide tiered, structured academic and behavioral interventions to promote a positive, productive learning environment.
- Coordinate instruction between Special Education, Title and General Education Services to align content, goals and supports.

Strategic Plan Goal: Goal 2- Responsible, Resilient, Empowered Learners

Outcome: b. Increased percentage of regular school attenders.

SEL Gap Goal: Improve the average year-to-date, school-wide regular attendance (95% and above) from 44.5% to 49.5% for Kindergarten to 2nd grade and from 45% to 55% for 3rd grade to 5th grade from April 2023 to April 2024.

Actions:

To Follow an extensive Tiered Attendance Plan and Awareness Planner

- A small example for Tier 1 includes:
 - o Proactive Communication with Families at vital times of the year (breaks, end of year).
 - o Monthly recognition for good attendance.
 - o Attendance tips and positive outcomes in Families Newsletter.
 - o Attendance Signs posted around campus (Main Entrance, Office, on Monitor, Around Building, Website)
 - Mini Lesson on the Importance of Attendance during Admin Introductions the first few weeks of school.
 - o <u>Talking points</u> given to teachers to share during Family Connections Meetings on the importance of attendance.
 - o Monday Morning Slides for classrooms (use quarterly slides too) with facts in Notes from the Office
 - Attendance data will be reported monthly to the staff in Notes from the Office.
 - o Purposeful practices around:
 - Family Engagement through a positive, welcoming environment, events and communication.
 - Culturally Relevant Practices.


