




North Thurston Community Survey - Demographics

of Survey Respondents shown with each bar













Which school(s)/building do your children attend, do your feel most connected to, is your neighborhood school? Choose all that apply.






If yes, do you feel you (or your adult child) received a quality education that helped you (them) prepare for a career or college?






Based on your own expectations and standards for K-12 public education, what overall assessment would you give North Thurston Public Schools?



When it comes to managing the school district's budget, and investing in student achievement and facilities, how would you rate the North Thurston Public Schools?




Were you previously aware of the district's focused work around equity?
