Strategic Plan Goal: Preparedness for Post-Secondary Success

Every student will successfully navigate the critical transitions in their personalized learning trajectory and will graduate from high school prepared for success in college, career, and post-secondary experiences.

Outcome: Increased high school graduation rates for all student groups.

Academic Gap Goal: Increase the percentage of Pacific Islander / Native Hawaiian students passing all classes from 52% and 55% (for Fall/Spring semesters in SY 2022-2023) to 70% each semester in SY 2023-2024.

INDICATORS OF PROGRESS:

2023-2024 School Year, End of 1st Semester:

- 78% of all students are passing all classes.
- 87% of all students passing 5 out of 6 classes
- 65% of our PI/NH are passing all classes
- 86% of our PI/NH are passing 5 out of 6 classes
- 77% of all NTHS 9th graders passed all classes compared to 77% in the 2022-2023 SY
- 78% of all NTHS 10th graders passed all classes compared to 80% in the 2022-2023 SY
- 73% of all NTHS 11th graders passed all classes compared to 78% in the 2022-2023 SY
- 83% of all NTHS 12th graders passed all classes compared to 81% in the 2022-2023 SY

CONCERN AREA: Our goal is that all students will graduate with skills needed to pursue the college and career goals of their choice. Increasing passing rates are necessary to increase graduation rates, in particular the passing rates of our Pacific Islander/Native Hawaiian students that were significantly below the overall student population.

NEXT STEPS:

- Continue focus on teacher clarity.
- Support Teachers during full implementation of 4-point grading.
- Continue to engage in individual conversations with struggling students, in particular, our NH/PI.

Strategic Plan Goal: Responsible, Resilient Empowered Learners

Every student will feel safe as an empowered, responsible, and resilient learner, open to and accepting cultural diversity and perspectives, and empowered to advocate for and pursue their own educational passions.

Outcome: Increased percentage of regular school attenders.

Academic Gap Goal: Pacific Islander/Native Hawaiians regular attenders for SY 22-23 was 25% S1

INDICATORS OF PROGRESS:


- *increased regular attenders of our PI/NH in 9th grade from 33% in Sept 22SY to 64% in Sept 23SY
- *increased regular attenders of our PI/NH in 10th grade from 40% in Sept 22SY to 88% in Sept 23SY
- *increased regular attenders of our PI/NH in 11th grade from 42% in Sept 22SY to 54% in Sept 23SY
- *decreased with our 12th grade PI/NH regular attenders from 60% to 58%.
- * increased regular attenders of all in 9th grade from 52% in Sept 22SY to 57% in Sept 23SY
- *increased regular attenders of all 10th grade from 52% Sept 22SY to 60% Sept 23SY
- *decreased at risk attenders overall 11th grade from 19% Sept 22SY to 16% Sept 23SY
- *decreased regular attenders overall 12th grade from 49% Sept 22SY to 45% Sept 23Y

CONCERN AREA: During and after covid attendance of regular attenders has been decreasing. To improve our academic and social Emotional of our students, we need to continue to increase our regular attenders. Our PI/NH seniors regular attenders is holding steady while the chronic is increasing and the at risk is decreasing. This pattern holds the same with our overall senior students from the Sept 22SY to Sept 23SY.

NEXT STEPS:


- Continue to focus on restorative practices and full usage of the Restorative Center.
