Strategic Plan Goal 5 – Preparedness for Post-Secondary Success

Outcome a.— Increased percentage of students passing classes . . .

Strategic Plan Goal 3 – Critical Thinkers and Solution Seekers

Outcome b.—Increased percentage of students applying learning to collaboratively engage in solving relevant challenges within the classroom, school and community.

ACADEMIC GAP GOAL: During the 22-23 school year, a minimum of 90% of our students will pass all of their classes up from 50% last year (93 students up from 55 students).

INDICATORS OF PROGRESS:

- SY 22-23, Semester 1 – 85% of students passed all classes. An additional 10% of students passed all but 1 class.

CONCERN AREA:

- A significant number of students, almost 1/3 of the students who passed all of their classes did so in the final 2-3 weeks of the Semester.

NEXT STEPS:

- Work with staff to expand on our engaging, cross-content collaborative courses
- Offer “Repair Shops” for students to get additional academic support
- Implement UDL framework
- Refine teacher clarity work
- Refine grading practices as more information comes out
- Ensure Tier 1 practices are in place every day

Strategic Plan Goal 2 – Responsible, Resilient, Empowered Learners

Outcome a.— Increased percentage of students meeting social, emotional, and behavioral expectations.

Outcome d.—Increased percentage of students open to and accepting cultural diversity.

BEHAVIOR GAP GOAL: During the 22-23 school year, we will increase the percent positive responses from 38% in SY21-22 to 90% in the category: “Most students are respectful of others at this school” on the EES Student SEL survey.

INDICATORS OF PROGRESS:

- Recent mid-year survey data saw no change in percent positive responses. When adding responses, *Sometimes True*, the current data shows an increase by 6%.

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CONCERN AREA:

- While students indicate a significant increase in positive ratings for *Feeling safe at Envision* and *There is at least one adult in the building who knows and cares about me*, student perception of mutual respect continues to be an area of concern.

NEXT STEPS:

- Engage Principal’s Student Advisors in a restorative problem-solving circle on ways to improve student mutual respect
- Continue to implement Social-Emotional curriculum: Character Strong—weekly lessons, DESSA, and Restorative Practices
- Maintain strong schoolwide PBIS systems & focus
- Collaborate with students and families on ways w can best meet their needs
