Native Student Programs

- Continuing to represent work and district on state and national levels
- Presented on the government-to-government training at the NIEA conference
- Developing online Native educational resources for the district
- Completed and submitted annual performance review for Title VI grant
- Providing training to schools
- Providing student and family support
- Co-developing truancy policies and practices with Nisqually Tribe
- Working closely with Since Time Immemorial Steering Committee
- Working to expand programming to more schools
- Jerad and Alison have been asked to teach six classes in undergraduate and graduate teaching programs at PLU

Native STEAM Program

- Led by Laura Bowman
- Laura presented on the after-school program at the Third Annual Indigenous Children, Youth and Families conference
- ❖ Meets Mondays and Wednesdays 2:10 3:30 p.m.
- Monday covers Native art and plants and food with Cindy Swenson (Cowlitz)
- Wednesdays include science, robotics, and drone technology with Mac Jones
- Students that attend 75% or more of the courses are eligible for .5 science credit
- Guest speakers have recently included Ojibwe robotics designer, Danielle Boyer
- Field Trips to NAYLA (Native American Youth Leadership Academy), Burke Museum, Museum of Flight, BFJ Wildlife Refuge, Museum of Pop Culture, and the FIRE Summit
- Laura leads cultural projects that include tying drums, beading, making medicine bags, making fry bread, seafood chowder, and three sister's stew (ingredients purchased from Native-owned companies)

Native Studies

- 11th-grade Native Literature and Native History. 12th-grade Native Civics
- Jerad and Alison presented our instructional pedagogy at the NIEA conference in Oklahoma
- Students led educational and awareness projects for Indigenous People's Day
- Will be attending a customized, equity-focused visit to Saint Martin's University
- 11th-grade Native Studies students will be teaching an undergraduate teaching program class at Pacific Lutheran University
- 12th-grade Native Studies studies will be hosting graduate PLU teaching students at River Ridge for a course on identifying bias in state standards
- Classes officially become college credit-bearing on January 1 and will be retroactive for this year
- Jerad and Alison presented at Washington State Council for the Social Studies
- Jerad and Alison will be presenting at the National Council for Social Studies in December



A Couple Reminders from Jerad When Teaching about Native People and History:

- Do seek information directly from Native Sources: tribes, people, news or perspective. And, check that a source passes the "nothing about us without us" test.
- Don't trivialize or appropriate Native culture including clothing, symbols, ceremonies, or other items or practices of cultural significance.
