


SMS Dress Code

The shaded portion of this figure represents front and back views. These parts of the body must be covered in all positions (sitting, standing, bending, reaching) while attending school.

All students are expected follow the NTPS dress code. A student will be given the option of changing into acceptable attire or risk being disciplined if they refuse to change. Reasons a students dress may be inappropriate are but not limited to: 1) could pose a health or safety hazard, 2) may represent membership in a gang or hate group, 3) could damage school property, and 4) could disrupt the educational process.



Heads: Students must remove all headwear* while in SMS buildings.

SMS Standards – Headbands are allowed but may not be bandanas of any kind. Non-prescription sunglasses are not to be worn in the building.

Torso: Clothing must cover stomachs, backs, shoulders, chests and undergarments.

SMS Standards: Skirts, dresses and shorts must cover the shaded areas in the figure. Undergarments and midriff must be completely covered. Sleepwear such as: pajamas, non-rubber soled slippers, blankets, stuffed animals, and related clothing articles are not allowed unless it is a specific administration -approved spirit day.

Legs: Shorts, skirts and dresses must be longer than mid-thigh. Undergarments must be covered and not visible.

SMS Standards: There should be no large tears or holes in clothing in the region shaded on this diagram, according to the NTPS dress code.

Other Guidelines

*Headwear includes hats, hoods, bandanas, and headwraps. (Exceptions will be made for medical, religious and other approved reasons).

Clothing that promotes drugs, alcohol, tobacco, violence, is sexually suggestive or displays inappropriate pictures or writing is prohibited.

Any clothing worn in a manner identified as gang-related is prohibited.

Jewelry that can pose safety hazards is prohibited.

Exceptions to dress code standards may be made for dance or school activities.

As trends change, we do make adjustments to our dress code to address issues that arise.
