We will be adding a quilt piece for another great leader - **Katherine Johnson was an American Mathematician** whose calculations of orbital mechanics as a NASA employee were critical to the success of the first us crewed spaceflights. She was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom and Congressional gold medal. Heads of **NASA** said Johnson helped our Nation enlarge the frontiers of space even as she made huge strides that opened doors for women and people of color. Katherine Johnson died on Monday at 101 years of age. The movie “Hidden Figures” Featured Katherine Johnson’s life and work. Katherine Johnson made America Better!
