<p>Bucket Drumming Activities- You can create a drum from lots of items. Two rules to start:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Make sure to ask your family before you turn household items into drums 2. Don't drive your family crazy! Find a practice space and time that works for those you live with. <p>Drumstick alternatives - pencils, wooden spoon handles, sticks from the outdoors, cardboard tubes, chopsticks, Bucket drum alternatives - plastic plant pots, cans, cardboard boxes, empty food containers, cooking pots.</p> <p>Create a "groove" A groove is a set of 4 rhythm patterns that match this form: A A A B. The first three patterns are the same and the fourth is different. The fourth pattern is called the "fill" and functions as a transition to a new groove or a repetition of the first groove. Create a groove and teach it to a family member!</p> <p>Extension: If you have more than one drummer, use the fill as "solo time." Take turns making up patterns on the spot during the B section.
